2. Like most states, Virginia preempts localities from enforcing their own homemade gun control ordinances to prevent gun owners from running afoul of a patchwork of criminal laws. However, despite the overwhelming enactment of Second Amendment sanctuary resolutions in virtually all localities, the 2020 General Assembly passed legislation that allows localities to enact ordinances restricting the carrying or possession of firearms in certain municipal facilities.

5. The \$35 local law-enforcement portion of the concealed handgun permit fee was determined at a time when local law enforcement spent \$28 running fingerprints through the FBI. The local fingerprint requirement for concealed handgun permit applicants was repealed in 2012. The fee was NEVER meant to be a revenue stream, or profit on citizens' self-defense rights. There are numerous positions in law-enforcement that come with built-in down time (running radar, dispatching service calls, jailor duties, among others), so there is NO need to budget hours to process permits.

6. Gun control politicians in Richmond have declared war on the right to keep and bear arms. Many localities rushed to declare themselves Second Amendment Sanctuaries, resolving that absolutely NO county resources would be used to enforce unconstitutional legislation out of D.C. or Richmond.

7. In 2004, Virginia's preemption statute (§15.2-915) was amended to prohibit localities from adopting or enforcing actions governing the purchase, possession, transfer, ownership, carrying, storage, or transportation of firearms, ammunitions, or components.

Nevertheless, many localities still have outdated ordinances that are not in compliance with the Code of Virginia.

8. The Virginia Community Colleges System (VCCS) Policy Manual is a so-called “living document” that guides the operation of all community colleges in the Commonwealth. The leadership, Chancellor, and State Board for Community Colleges make and approve changes in policies for the entire system of community colleges. The leadership of VCCS mandated a no-weapons policy (3.14.6 B) that infringes on the Right to Keep and Bear Arms of law-abiding faculty, staff, and students. This policy has been imposed from the top down by education bureaucrats and, for example, when adopted, revoked the common-sense self-defense policy then in place at Blue Ridge Community College. It also prevented other community colleges from adopting common-sense self-defense policies. The effect is to deny effective self-defense rights to all faculty, staff, and students, including retired military veterans, former police officers and other competent, capable men and women licensed to carry a concealed weapon in the Commonwealth of Virginia.

Will you OPPOSE your County Government making financial grants to the corresponding regional community college as long as the VCCS Chancellor and State Board continue to deny the Second Amendment rights of law-abiding, faculty, staff, students, and guests on campus?
